THE ORIGIN OF MONEY

Money: Simple definition; Anything that can be used to make a payment where the recipient trusts that he can use it to make another payment.

Trade items such as coins and other diverse forms of money have been used for barter or trade for thousands of years. The exchange of goods or items that were needed, established customs and rules on how various items should be valued.

The exchange of goods

for trade was established when both parties agreed the trade was fair.

Trade routes covering 775 miles using Anatolian Obsidian
(clear volcanic rock) as money dates back to 7500 B.C. Flint mining in
Britain dates back to 4000 B.C. Flint tools could be exchanged for
food and other goods. Just a few hundred years ago, British rule
used tobacco, lumber, furs, musket balls and beads which took the
place of scarce silver and gold coins. Country pay is still used
today in rural areas for barter of farm products.

Most cultures and societies have agreed that precious metals, gold, silver and copper, always have value for exchange. The Mesopotamian Cuneiform tablets mention silver being weighed to official standards for rents, taxes and compensation circa 2400 B.C. Gold was adopted for monetary use after silver and copper.

and there, however, that is still all in the works!


But, the reason we are mentioning the banquet is because we have had several members ask about donating for the gift baskets.

Who invented the first coin?

Coins were introduced as a method of payment around the 6th or 5th century BCE. **The invention of coins is still shrouded in mystery**: According to Herdotous, coins were first minted by the Lydians, while Aristotle claims that the first coins were minted by Demodike of Kyrme, the wife of King Midas of Phrygia.

What is the biggest treasure find in history?

The largest monetary treasure haul found was on the wreck code named **Black Swan**, discovered by Odyssey Marine Exploration in 2007 off of Gibraltar. The salvage team reportedly found 17 tons of coins valued at \$500 million; an amount that is both staggering and said to be "unprecedented" in the treasure hunting world.

What is the most recent treasure to be discovered?

A buried treasure has been recovered after spending centuries underwater. Explorers have found numerous artifacts from the Nuestra Señora de las Maravillas, which translates to "Our Lady of Wonders." The nearly 900-ton Spanish ship sunk in 1656 after it collided into one of the boats from its fleet and crashed into a coral reef near the Bahamas. The ship had been carrying a lot of cargo when it went under, and millions of items have been recovered for many years, from the 1650s to the 1990s. But the most recent discovery by dive teams found coins, jewels and gemstones that previously belonged to knights who fared the sea.

These items will be displayed later this month at the new Bahamas Maritime Museum.
